All glory to you (Who is like our God?)

...how and why it was written

One of my favourite things to think about is just how beyond expression God's amazing goodness is. He is so beyond any comparison, and anything language and melody can convey. And yet we can't help but try to find a way to praise that expresses the answer to 'Who is like our God?'

This is one of my attempts – written during personal devotion, and used a lot in corporate times of worship. It's a joyful song which celebrates God's goodness and complete one-of-a-kind-ness, calling us to higher praise which ensures God gets the highest place in our hearts.

It focuses most of its narrative on the central gospel message – what better focus to try and express the greatness and goodness of our God.

...how, where and when it could be used

This is one for corporate sung worship, and works well at different temps and in a number of different keys clustered around the original G it was written in. The chorus also works quite well as a stand-alone, or linked in to other gospel-focussed songs.

...its place on the journey to where world and worship meet

Simply this – it expresses the heart of the Christian gospel – that our God is incomparable for very many reasons, but none more than this – that he so **loved the world** that he gave his only son – that whoever **believes in him** might have eternal life.
